Curve Café history

Purchased by Fritz and Wilma Mandt in 1953 from Frank Maarz

The Restaurant, with 2 cabins and a garage behind it was situated closer to downtown. On the same side of the curve, west of Pleasant Street surrounded on three sides by Piotrowski's Sinclair Station & Garage plus some cabins they rented. Parking was limited to area in front of the restaurant.

In April 1958 the restaurant, one cabin and the garage were moved to the one-acre lot purchased from Harold Dahlen. The other cabin was demolished, the restaurant was closed for a month. The cabin that was moved was made into a 4-bedroom house, with one bathroom and living room.

A new roof was added to the Curve some time in the early 60's.

A faulty deep fryer caused a fire in 1965 (I think); restaurant was closed for a month. The kitchen was gutted; the dining room had considerable smoke damage.

The Garage was expanded and breezeway added in 1966.

Fritz Mandt added the entry area, but I'm not sure when. Fritz and Wilma sold the restaurant to Joe Leto in 1976. He sold it a couple years later to Bill and Mary Ann Fiedler.
